


Figure 1. Graph shows Opportunistic Sighting data/results from January 2017 until December 2017

From Figure 1, it is shown that Pig-tailed Macaque species was mostly found compare to other wildlife species in forest reserve areas for the whole year of 2017. Four species that categorised as endangered species; Bornean pygmy elephant, Orang utan (nest), Hairy Nosed Otter, and Bornean gibbon were also found during data collection while two species categorised as near threatened; Crested fireback, and Giant Squirrel.
